


What is Day of Silence?

- Takes place this year on Friday, April 14
- Observed by those who may choose to take a daylong vow of silence as a show of empathy and support for students who feel voiceless, isolated, and alone
- While concentrated on LGBTQ+ students, the Day of Silence is a day to show support for all students who may not be able to be their authentic selves
- That silence is broken after school by student groups throughout the District








Brief History

- Began in 1996
- Students from all 50 states and around the world participate
- Initiated in SRVUSD by LGBTQ+ high school students
- March 8, 2016: SRVUSD students, in conjunction with SRVEA, successfully petitioned our Board for the first resolution in support of the Day of Silence
- Many of our SRVUSD schools now participate


Why do we celebrate the Day of Silence?
